

The theory I like most is that vacation days are centered on the Feast of the Assumption because after her life on earth Mary now rests in heaven with her son. Our vacation on earth is a foretaste of our rest in heaven.

Sunday School ~ 2016 - 2017

Dear Parent(s) / Guardian(s) of Children in our CCD Program,

We hope this letter finds you well and enjoying a relaxing and peaceful summer. As we look forward to the 2016-2017 CCD year, it is the perfect time for us to reflect and to provide some important information and update you on what is new and in store for the 2016-2017 parish year.

1) We are happy and excited to welcome Mrs. Bridget Murphy as the new Director of Religious Education for the parish of Saint Rose. She is familiar to most having served at Saint Rose school for 38 years as both a teacher and the Assistant Principal. She comes with experience and knowledge in administration and education. Most importantly she comes as a woman with deep faith and love for Christ and His Church. I am sure you will join me in welcoming her to the Saint Rose family and offering our support and help throughout the years ahead.

2) ***Religious Education for Children (CCD) will begin on Sunday, September 25th 2016 at 9:15am.*** Students, with their parents, should report to the school auditorium on time. On that day students will be assigned their class and teacher. As students attend their first class, parents are asked to remain in the auditorium for an important meeting.

3) This year we have lowered the fee for attending CCD. ***The registration fee is now \$50.00. This fee is due no later than September 25th.*** There will be an additional \$50.00 fee for students receiving a sacrament (Holy Communion or Confirmation).

4) Classes will remain on Sundays **beginning at 9:15 AM** (following the **8:00 AM Mass**) **to 10:45 AM** (prior to the **11:00 AM Mass**). **After 10:45 AM** parents are asked to pick up their child at dismissal.

The change this year is that ***students will no longer be attending the 11:00 AM Mass as a class. Instead they are expected to attend Sunday Mass with their family.*** They can attend Mass at **5:00 PM (Saturday Vigil), 8:00 AM, 11:00 AM, or 12:30 PM (in Polish).** *Students will be receiving a card where the priest or his delegate will sign it and it is to be returned to class the following Sunday.* This change allows the families to pray the Mass together and gives the parents the opportunity to be the first of teachers in their child's life of faith.

5) In accordance with diocesan policy, preparation for Confirmation is a period of two (2) full years. Therefore, those who are registered and enrolled in the first year for Confirmation class will be confirmed in either Spring 2018 or Fall 2018. Therefore, students will have two (2) full years of preparation before receiving the sacrament of Confirmation.

6) Those who attended Confirmation class last year will be confirmed on Saturday, October 22nd (as long as they have fulfilled all requirements). There will be three Sunday classes and a retreat prior to Confirmation that students are expected and must attend. After Confirmation students are to no longer attend class on Sundays. However, they will be strongly encouraged to attend our once a month youth gatherings. More information regarding these gatherings will be given out in September.

The commitment and diligence of our volunteer faculty coupled with a mature approach and desire to encounter Jesus on the part of every student and support from you, the parents, will bear much fruit during the year.


