## *What Should I Do At Mass?*

Mother Church earnestly desires that all the faithful should be led to that fully conscious, and active participation in liturgical celebrations which is demanded by the very nature of the liturgy. So what does this full, active and conscious participation look like?



First, full participation means that one must be present for the entire liturgy, meaning that one arrives early enough to prepare for Mass and stays through the singing of the closing hymn. Growing up it seems to me that too much emphasis was put on what was the minimum amount of time one could be at Mass for it to "count". This seems overly legalistic to me and tends to promote the idea that we are somehow earning points with God by coming to Mass rather than our worship expressing our thanks for the salvation He has freely given to us.

Second, actively participating means engaging in all parts of the liturgy while looking for the message God is sending to each one of us every time we step into the church for Mass. This outward participation is not only for ourselves, but by doing all we can to participate we share the work of the liturgy and help each other to actively pray.

Third, it is not only the outward signs of our participation that are important, but that we are conscious of what it is we are doing when we gather to pray. It is not enough to simply say the words of the prayers, to participate in the singing, to make the sign of the cross, etc. if there is not something deeper happening within each one of us. This process of transformation should be deepening each week when we attend the liturgy together.

My hope is that by beginning with these three simple practices we can continue to deepen our prayer together and participate fully, actively and consciously each time we gather for the celebration of the Eucharist.

Religious Education Program

Dear Parishioners,

We are very blessed that our Religious Education Program continues to grow. However, along with that blessing, we have to struggle to find teachers to meet the needs of all our children. We hope that if you are a parent of one of our students, a grandparent, a retiree, or someone who would like to help pass on our faith, that you will consider being a catechist.

There are not many requirements. First and foremost, you must be a practicing Catholic. All catechists must take a VIRTUS course, sign a Code of Conduct, and be willing to submit to a Background check. It is also required that catechists receive 10 hours of Living and Leading by Faith credits. These courses are often free, and there are some offered online for a nominal fee. These courses help deepen the understanding of our faith.

Our year runs from September until May. We meet with the children on Sunday mornings from 9:15AM until 10:45AM. If you do not feel that you can commit to a full year, perhaps you would consider being a substitute teacher. The requirements are the same, but Living and Leading by Faith credits are not mandatory.

If you are interested or would like more information, please call me at the Rectory. I am available Monday and Tuesday mornings from 9AM until 12:30PM. At any other times, please leave a message.
